Chemicals and contaminants life cycle (center) and associated processes and pathways which result in environmental and human exposure.



- Pesticides: product registration, use, sales/distribution, production
- Non-point source water pollution (farms)

Agency of Natural Resources

- Air: registration of Pollution Sources, NESHAPs
- Surface Waters: point source discharges of water pollution
- Drinking Water: water supply
- Groundwater: indirect discharge, underground injection
- Waste: Spills, RCRA (hazardous/solid), salvage yard, UST
- Pollution Prevention: Act 100



Common Themes: Regulated Entity

- Inconsistent identification of chemicals in products with multiple chemicals
- Exemptions do not capture complete inventory
- Confusing for small businesses
- Inconsistent format
- Not updated in real time

Report Information to Agency

- Inconsistent chemical identifier
- Inconsistent identification of chemicals in products with multiple chemicals
- Exemptions do not capture complete inventory
- Confusing for small businesses
- Variable format, method, reporting periods, supporting documents
- Variable reporting criteria
- Multiple contacts within and across agency(ies)
- May be challenging to make changes at state level due to federal requirements

Submit Fees to Agency

- Variable method for submission of fees
- Variable methods for issuing refunds

QA/QC of Information

- See Report Information to Agency

- Many different agency tracking system/databases
- Limited resources
- Variable methods to address deficient information
- QA/QC happens multiple times
- Limited resources with technical expertise

Production of Information

- Variable format
- May not be in useful format
- Management of confidential business information
- Safety and security concerns
- Variable timelines for production
- Confusing for public
- May be resource intensive to change format of data available to public due to federal requirements/third party vendors
- Limited resources
