Environmental Justice Act 154 Tasks

Overall Responsibilities:

- The Environmental Justice Advisory Council (Advisory Council or the AC): provide independent advice and recommendations to State agencies and the General Assembly on matters relating to environmental justice, including the integration of environmental justice principles into State programs, policies, regulations, legislation, and activities.
- The Interagency Environmental Justice Committee (Interagency Committee or the IA Committee): guide and coordinate State agency implementation of the Environmental Justice State Policy and provide recommendations to the General Assembly for amending the definitions and protections set forth in this chapter.
- Both the Advisory Council and the Interagency Committee shall consider and incorporate the <u>Guiding Principles for a Just</u> <u>Transition</u> developed by the Just Transitions Subcommittee of the Vermont Climate Council in their work.
- Must meet no more than 8 times per year, at least 4 times jointly. Meetings may be held in person, remotely, or in a hybrid format to facilitate maximum participation and shall be recorded and publicly posted on the Secretary's website
- Each group may elect two co-chairs
