ACT 154 Chemical Working Group REGULATORY PROGRAM SUMMARY

Regulatory Program: Include full title and any common name of the regulatory program.

e.g. Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA); Vermont Hazardous Waste Management Program

Statutory Authority: Include federal and state statutory citation(s) that provide regulatory authority.

e.g. 42 U.S.C. § 6901 et seq; 10 V.S.A. Chapter 159

Regulatory Authority: Include federal and state regulatory citation(s) that provide regulatory authority.
